Model Ordinance - Right to Clean Water

Board Discussion on Model Ordinance

Summary Explanation & Background:

Attached is a model ordinance provided by Board member Simasek. The Florida Rights of Nature Network (FRONN) provided this draft model ordinance. Per FRONN, this model ordinance removes the explicit rights of nature language from the text of the law. Instead, it takes those rights, and merges them into the human right to clean water. In other words, the new laws only recognize that human right, and then they protect waterways by saying that the human right isn't possible unless waterways are healthy, have a right to flow, etc. They believe that because SB 712 only prohibited the recognition of rights for ecosystems, so the new version does not include what has been preempted by the State.
