I. CALL TO ORDER

III. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM JUNE 21, 2023

IV. PUBLIC PERIOD

Chair Krivan opened the public comment period.

A Seminole County resident, 614 Lake Shore Drive, who lives on Lake Hope, stated concerns about a mass of vegetation within the lake. Lakes Advisory Board inquired from the City Engineer about what was occurring. City Engineer Eide-Cadle stated she provided her contact information to the resident before the meeting and will work through the concerns with the resident.

Chair Krivan closed the public comment period.

V. OLD BUSINESS**1. PROHIBITION OF BOTTLES AND CANS ON ALL CITY LAKES**

Lakes Advisory Board discussed the prohibition of bottles and cans and concluded that they cannot search anybody that would enter a body of water within city limits. The Board moved to deny further discussions at this time for prohibition of bottles and cans. However, the Board moved to make a decision on the following requests to be presented to City Council:

1. Request the Public Information Officer (PIO) post to social media, a minimum of twice a month, messages about protecting lakes and not littering, to include pictures.
2. Request to add two additional trash cans to Dog Island.
3. Request to add at least one additional trash can and at least one recycling can to Fort Maitland Park boat ramp.
4. Request to add signage, including fine amount, to discourage littering at Fort Maitland at the boat ramp.

2. MAINTENANCE OF PRIVATE PROPERTY SHORELINES

Lakes Advisory Board discussed maintenance of private property shorelines. Chair Krivan stated that removing native plants from shorelines could give access to invasive species to move in. The board agreed that the city should not use stormwater funds to remove vegetation from private shorelines per the City of Maitland Code of Ordinance. The Board unanimously moved to deny any recommendations at this time as it relates to maintenance of private property shorelines.
