Subject: East-West Trail Updates

Summary Explanation & Background: Within the next several weeks, the City of Maitland will be completing construction on the Westside Bike Trail and a newly refurbished and widened boardwalk at the Maitland Community Park. These two projects will complete a significant portion of the East-West trail network by connecting numerous parks, schools, and other community assets to many of the residential areas within the City of Maitland. This is an accomplishment that necessitated the design and construction of seven different trail segments over a ten-year period. Grant funding totaling nearly \$1.1 million dollars helped to offset construction costs of this trail network. Additionally, it should be noted that development of multi-use trails for increased pedestrian connectivity has consistently been the number one park and recreation amenity desired by Maitland residents in community-wide parks and recreation needs studies conducted in 2015 and 2023. An overall map of the East-West trail has been included with this agenda package for your reference. A brief presentation will also be provided at the October PRAB meeting outlining details of the facility, possible future trail enhancements, and the significance that this amenity will have in providing generations of Maitland residents with a place to exercise, connect to various community activity centers, and recreate with friends and family members.
