

**MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY OF MAITLAND
CANVASSING BOARD HELD MARCH 8, 2022 AND MARCH 11, 2022,
AT THE ORANGE COUNTY SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS OFFICE**

Councilmember Guthrie called the special meeting of the City of Maitland Canvassing Board ("the Board") to order at 5:04 PM at the Orange County Supervisor of Elections Office("SOE") 119 W. Kaley Street, Orlando, Florida. Present were Canvassing Board members, Councilmember Guthrie, City Manager Anselmo, City Clerk Hollingsworth, and Resident Houck.

Councilmember Guthrie stated that the purpose of the special meeting was for the City Canvassing Board to certify the results of the General Municipal Election held this date. The board shall reconcile the results from precincts, early voting, vote by mail (absentee), provisional, and challenged ballots.

The approved Orange County Canvassing Board criteria (which track the Florida Statutes) was presented by City Manager Anselmo and accepted unanimously by the Board for reviewing any questionable ballots presented.

Councilmember Guthrie opened for public comments. There being no one present to speak, the public comment period was closed.

Supervisor of Election's staff presented the Board with three (3) vote-by-mail ballots for inspection, review and duplication. Upon completion of duplicating process the three (3) vote by mail ballots were duly processed and counted.

At 5:53 PM, the meeting was recessed and reconvened at 5:59 PM.

Supervisor of Election's staff then presented the Board with one (1) vote-by-mail ballot with a signature that did not match the signature on the voter registration roll and one (1) vote-by-mail ballot that was returned to SOE with deceased marked on the outside of the envelope. Also presented were nine (9) vote-by-mail ballots received missing the signature on the outside of the envelope. The nine (9) registered voters had been contacted by the SOE and advised that they had until 5 p.m. on Thursday, March 10, 2022, to submit a completed vote-by-mail cure affidavit. Board consensus was to reconcile all eleven (11) vote-by-mail ballots on Friday, March 11, 2022, when the Board reconvenes to certify election results.

At 6:08 PM, the meeting was recessed and reconvened at 7:04 PM.

Councilmember Guthrie made a motion that the City Canvassing Board of the General Municipal Election held on Tuesday, March 8, 2022, accepts the unofficial results of such election as prepared by the Elections Clerks and Inspectors, which no candidate received a majority of total votes cast and therefore no winner or run-off election is declared. Seconded by D. Houck.

The Board shall reconvene on Friday March 11, 2022, at the Supervisor of Elections Office to process any cured ballots and accept the official results.

There being no further business to come be for this Board, the meeting adjourned at 8:18 PM.

City Manager Anselmo called to order the special meeting of the City of Maitland Canvassing Board held on March 11, 2022, at 12:09 PM at the Orange County Supervisor of Elections Office, 119 W. Kaley Street, Orlando, Florida. Present were Canvassing Board members, City Clerk Hollingsworth, Resident member Houck and City Manager Anselmo.

The City Clerk stated the purpose of this meeting is for the Board to process the eleven (11) vote-by-mail ballots presented to the Board on March 8, 2022.

Supervisor of Elections, Bill Cowles, stated that three (3) vote-by-mail ballots were duly cured by March 10, 2022, at 5:00 PM.

Supervisor of Election's staff presented to the Board the one (1) vote-by-mail ballot with a signature difference. The Board unanimously rejected and duly processed this ballot as rejected.

Supervisor of Election's staff then presented to the Board the one (1) vote-by-mail ballot returned and marked on the envelope "DECEASED". The Board unanimously rejected and duly processed this ballot as rejected.

Supervisor of Election's staff then presented the Board with six (6) vote-by-mail ballots missing the signature on the outside of the ballot envelope that were not cured by affidavit by the March 10, 2022, 5 PM deadline. The Board unanimously rejected and duly processed the ballots as rejected.

Supervisor of Election's staff lastly presented the Board with three (3) vote-by-mail ballots missing the signature on the outside of the ballot envelope with a vote-by-mail cure affidavit attached to each ballot. Upon review and inspection, all three (3) vote-by-mail cured ballots were accepted by the Board and duly processed.

A motion was made by the City Clerk that the City Canvassing Board for the General Municipal Election held on Tuesday, March 8, 2022, accepts the official results of said election as prepared by the Election Clerks and Inspectors, that: Lori Wurtzel, the candidate for Council Seat #1, receiving the majority of total votes cast be declared the winner. Seconded by City Manager Anselmo and carried unanimously.

After the official results were certified and accepted, a manual audit of Precinct #16 was completed in accordance with Chapter 101.591, Florida Statutes and Rule 1SER08-04, F.A.C.

Post-election logic and accuracy testing was performed and accepted by the Board.

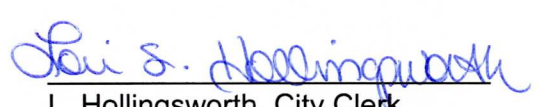
There being no further business to come before this Board, the meeting adjourned at 1:16 PM.
